
Costume Measurement Worksheet

Measuring for your costume

- Use a cloth or plastic (flexible) measuring tape.
- It is best if skater does not try to measure him or herself
- The skater should be wearing a leotard, swimsuit or undergarments, not street clothes.
- Girth measurements are usually the deciding factor when there are conflicting measurements.
- Please remember skaters and/or parents are responsible for measuring accurately.

- **A.** Chest: With arms relaxed down at sides, measure around the fullest part of the chest, keeping tape measure parallel to the floor.
- **B.** Waist: Measure around the natural waistline, the narrowest part of the upper body (not over shirt or pants).
- **C. Hips:** Measure around fullest part of the lower body, keeping tape straight and parallel to the floor.
- **D. Girth:** Measure from the center of one shoulder, down the front through crotch and back to starting point. This is the most important measurement in determining costume size.
- **E. Inseam:** Measure inside the leg, from crotch to below the ankle bone.
